Whether you have been on Oxygen or are just starting, YOU ARE RE-QUIRED TO NOTIFY THE OFFICE! The office will provide you with a sign for your door. ABSOLUTELY NO SMOKING IN UNIT! If you are caught smoking with oxygen on or off in apartment & Home Health Workers need to park on the street & NOT in Parking Pads provided for Tenants. They may only temporarily use if they are delivering items or picking up tenants.

Tenants please keep Office informed of changing phone numbers. WE MUST BE ABLE TO CONTACT YOU! Also, if you or another tenant has been ill or hospitalized, please let us know. Death in family, new grand/great-grand baby, or if congrats are in order, LET US KNOW!

*Any tenant who wants a pet MUST contact the office & see if the pet falls within the Pet Policy guidelines. A deposit of \$200 is required and can be paid over a 6 month period. The animal must have shots & fall within the qualifying definition of the Pet Policy. A Pet Policy MUST be signed & in the tenant file BEFORE you may have a pet!

NOT FOLLOWING THIS PROCEDURE CAN ENDANGER YOUR TENANCY WITH SALEN HOUSING!



Renew Your Medicaid or CHIP Coverage as COVID-19 becomes less of a threat, states will restart yearly Medicaid and Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) eligibility reviews. This means your state will use the information they have to decide if you or your family member(s) still qualify for Medicaid or CHIP coverage. If your state needs more information from you to make a coverage decision, they'll send you a renewal letter in the mail. Most children can still be covered through the Children's Health Insurance Program. For details, check your Medicaid notice or contact your state Medicaid office at the links below. Get ready to renew now Here are some things you can do to prepare for the renewal process: 1. Update your contact information -Make sure your state has your current mailing address, phone number, email, or other contact information. This way, they'll be able to contact you about your Medicaid or CHIP coverage. 2. Check your mail - Your state will mail you a letter about your coverage. This letter will let you know if you need to complete a renewal form to see if you still qualify for Medicaid or CHIP. 3. Complete your renewal form (if you get one) -Fill out the form and return it to your state right away to help avoid a gap in your coverage. If you no longer qualify for Medicaid or CHIP. You may be able to buy a health plan through the Health Insurance Marketplace, and get help paying for it. Marketplace plans are: 4 out of 5 enrollees can find plans that cost less than \$10 a month. Plans cover things like prescription drugs, doctor visits, urgent care, hospital visits, and more.

Dolly Parton's Famous Cinnamon Bread Recipe

Gerves 8; makes 2 loaves

Vegetable oil cooking spray

1/2 cup sugar

11/2 the cinnamon

- 11-lb loaf frozen bread dough, thawed
- 4 tbsp (1/2 stick) butter, melted
- 1 cup powdered sugar, sifted
- 2 they water or fresh lemon juice, plus more as needed
- 1. Coat two 8 1/2 x 4 1/2 x 2 1/2—inch loaf pans with vegetable oil cooking spray. In a shallow dish, combine the sugar and cinnamon and set aside.
- 2. Cut the dough lengthwise into two pieces. Make four shallow, crosswise slits in each piece. Brush the loaves all over with butter. Roll each loaf in the cinnamon mixture, packing it into the creases. Place loaves in the prepared pans and set aside in a warm place to rise for 30 minutes.
- As the bread rises, preheat oven to 300 degrees.
- 4. Bake the bread, turning the pans around once, for 35 minutes or until the top is golden and a tap on the bottom of the pan yields a hollow sound.
- 5. Meanwhile, make the glaze. In a small bowl, vigorously stir together the powdered sugar and water (or lemon juice), adding more liquid as needed, until the mixture is smooth. Turn the breads out onto a rack while they're still warm; drizzle with the glaze.





Long Distance Service: Riders need to plan to be on the vehicle all day. This service is provided as a group. All riders go together and return home together.


